From the Leadership Team

Dear Families,

Learning takes Effort and Practice

Have you ever 'learned' a new skill or gained new knowledge only to find in a week, month or years later you attempt to retrieve this knowledge or replicate the skill you are unable to do so effectively? This is very common. We often learn new skills and information but without regular practice, we are unable to use this new learning effectively.

Learning is a complex process that requires new information to be transferred and arranged from our working memory into our long-term memory. When we can retrieve information from our long-term memory efficiently, it is said we have learned that skill or acquired that knowledge.

For effective learning to occur, we need many opportunities to practice retrieving and applying the learning in new and varied contexts. While the number of exposures will vary, research suggests that on average learners need approximately 7-10 exposures to a new skill. However, this number may extend upwards of 70 practices, depending on the individual and the complexity of the task.

So, what are the implications of this in the context of Mathematics learning? Simply put, students require regular exposures to and practice of core concepts and skills. This is particularly relevant when students begin to develop an understanding and fluency with number facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).

Students can get frustrated and/or give up when they experience challenge or don't understand something at the first attempt. It is important to understand that learning can feel a little uncomfortable but through regular practice and perseverance learning will occur. It may not happen quickly, but with a commitment to practice, success is achievable.

Practice doesn't have to be long or arduous. Incidental opportunities to discuss practical mathematics in real life situations helps add to your child's exposure to math thinking and understanding. Opportunities could include; modelling and practicing counting objects around the home when tidying up, skip counting in collections such as pairs of socks, playing games that involve identifying numbers on cards or dice or getting children to compare and work out the cost of items while shopping. These discussions encourage students to recall information and provides opportunities to practice, therefore supporting the transference of knowledge for stronger and lasting mathematical understanding.

Statement of Accounts – Instalments now due

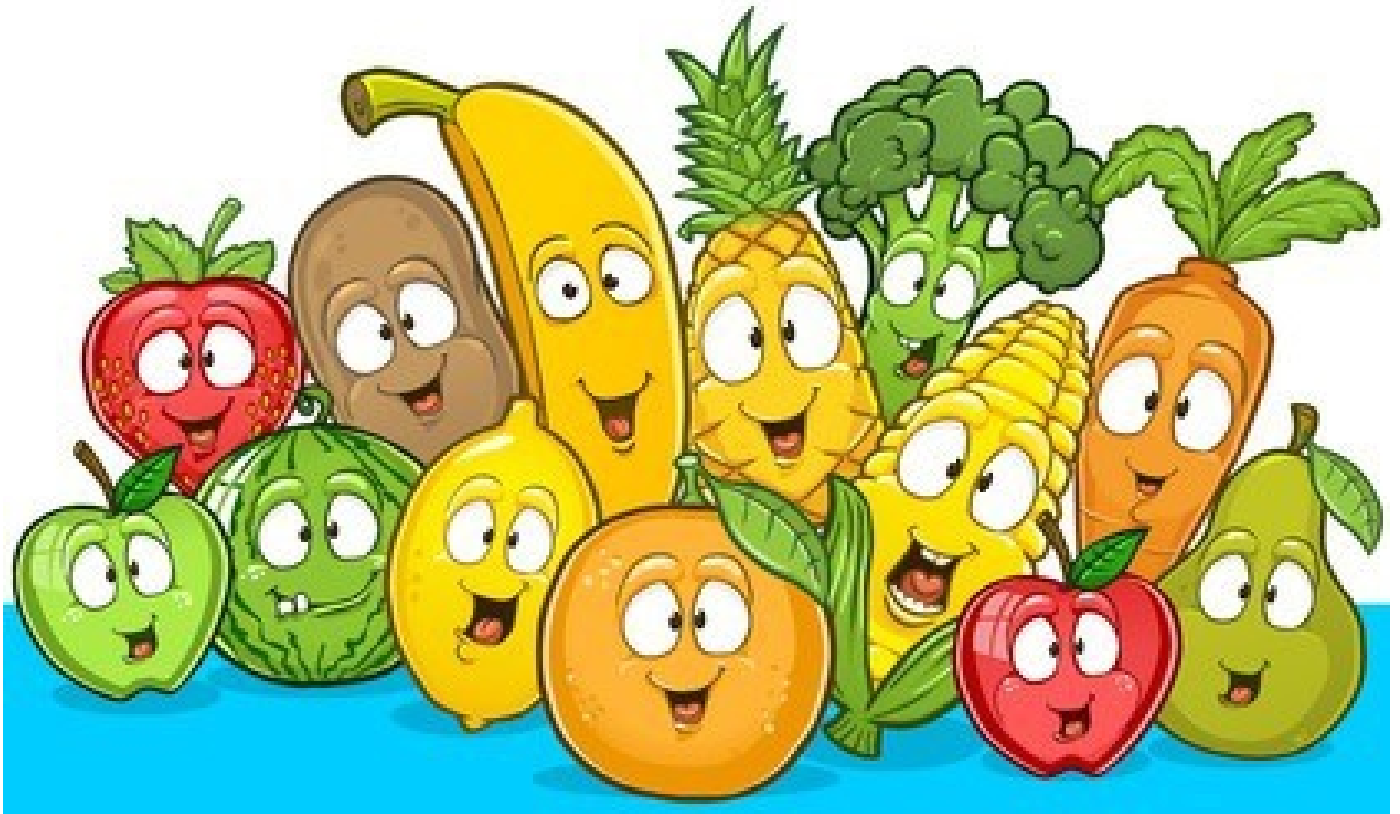

Marion Road and Cross Road Level Crossing

Site compound setup

We're removing congested tram level crossings to make your journey safer and more reliable

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly (\$0.50) funded \$400 million to remove the level crossings where the Glengyle tram line crosses Marion Road and Cross Road, Plympton. These works form part of the Tram Grade Separation Projects.

What's happening

We are setting up a project site compound, car parking and storage area on the vacant land at 145 and 147 Glengyle Terrace, and 15 Maynard Road, Plympton. These works will begin mid-March 2025.

Activities will include:

- setting up temporary fencing
- installing pavement
- delivering and setting up transportable site offices for project staff and amenities
- connecting utilities (generators may be used to help with power requirements)
- building storage areas and some car parking
- setting up gates and access points.

During intervention upgrade works between April and mid-2025, the site compound will operate from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Saturday during the day and 7pm to 6am, Sunday to Friday at night to support these works.

The site compound will also be required to support the future construction of the new overpass from the second half of 2025. We will provide more information about these activities closer to this time.

How this affects you

While the site is being set up, there will be changes to traffic conditions to keep everyone safe. Speed limits and intermittent lane restrictions will be in place on local side streets as required, including on Glengyle Terrace, Maynard Road and Alice Street.

Access to nearby properties and businesses will be kept open during the work. Some disturbances can be expected, but we will do our best to reduce them.

Pedestrians and cyclists should be careful when travelling through the area. For safety, some access may be restricted. Signs will be in place to direct you to alternative access and/or detours.

Glengyle Terrace – temporary access changes

To allow deliveries of construction materials and the transportable site offices to the site, the western section of Glengyle Terrace will be closed from Monday 24 March 2025 for approximately eight weeks. A temporary heavy vehicle route will be in place. Refer to the map on page 3.

During this time, some short-term parking restrictions will be required along Elizabeth Avenue, Maynard Road and Alice Street for approximately two weeks. Advance notice of changes will be provided to nearby properties.

Access to Maynard Road from Cross Road will be maintained during this time.

The level crossing at Cross Road will remain open during this time. Pedestrians and cyclists will be temporarily detoured around the work area to access the level crossing at Cross Road. Refer to the map on page 3 for information.
