PBIS

This term we are excited to announce the initial launch of Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports (PBIS) at St. John the Baptist Catholic School, along with a number of Catholic School in South Australia. PBIS is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioural supports and social culture needed for all students in a school to achieve success.

PBIS emphasises teaching positive behaviour expectations, acknowledging students for demonstrating those behaviours, and providing supports to students who may need additional assistance in meeting expectations. This framework fosters a positive and safe school environment where all students feel valued, respected, and engaged in their learning. Developing a whole school language and shared approach supports students to understand what is expected of them across all settings in the school, including learning areas, gathering spaces and playground.

PBIS encourages schools to use data to assess the effectiveness of their behavioural interventions and make informed decisions about how to best support students. By collecting and analysing data on behaviour incidents and outcomes, we can identify trends, implement targeted interventions, and continually improve our practices.

As we embark on the initial stages of implementing PBIS at St. John the Baptist Catholic School, the PBIS staff team will continue comprehensive training sessions and workshops to deepen their understanding of PBIS principles and practices. We will regularly share updates and insights in the newsletter about our PBIS learning as we work towards full implementation in 2025.



RRHAN-EC

Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect – Education and Care

The updated RRHAN-EC courses were released on plink on Monday 29 April 2024 and, for most of us, completion of the online update will need to be done before 31 December 2024 when our current certificate expires. You need to complete the new RRHAN-EC online update unless you already have a current certificate with an expiry date of 31 December 2027.

To access the online update please use this **link** to login as 'Non Department for Education staff login' OR if you don't already have a plink login, register **here**.

If your RRHAN-EC has already expired or you are new to education, please refer to the following guide which will help you to determine which course you need to do.

Which course is right for you?

My certificate expires on 31 December 2024 - do the online update only (takes about 2 hours).

My certificate is expired – start with the fundamentals. If you also work directly with children and young people, do the masterclass after you've finished the fundamentals course.

Finance News

School fee statements will be posted out in the next week to those who have a balance. Thank you to the many people who have paid in full, set up regular payment plans or paid the first instalment in Term 1. If you have not yet made your instalment for Term 1 please do so ASAP, a friendly reminder will be on your statement. If your account is in credit due to the 5% discount or Basketball refund this will be carried forward until next year. Some of the requests that families seek support for include:


- "We'd like our family to get out more"

This session is presented by Paul Dillon of <u>DARTA</u> who continues to work with many school communities to ensure they have access to quality information and best practice drug education.


Spaces will be limited to 120 people in person. Livestreaming will be available on the evening, with the recording available for 48 hours for viewing.
