Dear Families

### **Empowering Parental Engagement: Nurturing Open Communication**

As we enter the middle of Term Two, it is often a time children need extra support, strategies and empathy as they continue to navigate and learn to manage their friendships and relationships with peers. In our shared responsibility of nurturing and guiding our children, communication stands as the cornerstone of understanding and support. Understanding that incidents at school often have multiple perspectives is crucial in fostering empathy, problem-solving, and effective communication.

By acknowledging that there are often two sides to every story, parents can support their child in gaining a comprehensive understanding of the situation. Encouraging open dialogue and asking open ended questions, allows for a more holistic view of the incident, enabling parents to support them more effectively. We encourage parents and guardians to be in communication with their child's classroom teacher and contact them if there are any ongoing issue or concerns. Addressing this early is proactive and working in partnership with the school provides an opportunity for 'wrap around' pastoral care processes to be implemented as required.

At St John the Baptist Catholic school, staff use Restorative Practices to address conflicts and support children in building healthy relationships with their peers. These processes emphasise accountability, empathy, and understanding, allowing all children involved to learn and grow from their experiences. Each stage of a child's development is acknowledged, and strategies are developed to support this.

Asking open ended questions provides a great opportunity to hear about different aspects of your child's day and build a positive mindset towards school and their friendships. Below are a list of questions you may like to ask at the end of each day:

- Tell me about the best part of your day.
- What did you enjoy the most during lunchtime?
- Can you share something interesting that happened in class today?
- What was the most interesting thing you learned today?
- Can you describe a challenge you faced and how you overcame it?
- What made you laugh the hardest during recess?
- Did you notice anyone being kind or helpful to others?
- Is there something you wish you could have done differently today?
- What was the highlight of your day today?
- Did you make any new friends or have positive interactions with classmates?
- Did you participate in any fun activities or games during recess?
- Did you feel proud of something you accomplished today?
- What made you laugh or smile today?
- Who was kind to you today?
- Was there a moment where you felt particularly happy or excited?
- Did you have any memorable conversations with your teacher or friends?
- Did you help anyone or receive help from someone today?
- Did you enjoy any books or stories that were read in class?
- Did you feel challenged by any lessons today, and how did you handle it?
- Did you try anything new or different today?
- Who did you look after or care for today?
- What subject did you enjoy the most today, and why?
- Did you use any creative or innovative ideas during class projects?
- Was there anything that made you feel curious or sparked your interest today?
- Did you feel appreciated or recognised for your efforts by anyone at school?
- Did you feel a sense of accomplishment in completing any tasks today?
- Did you ask any questions or share your thoughts and opinions in class?
- What are you looking forward to doing tomorrow at school?
- What would you change or keep about today to make tomorrow a great day?
- Is there anything you'd like to share with me about your day that made you feel happy or proud?
- What are you most grateful for today?

These open-ended questions encourage your child to articulate their thoughts and feelings more comprehensively, fostering trust and openness.

**Great tips: Use 3 of these on the car ride home or write them on to paper strips and put them in a container so children can**

**pull them out at dinner time or before bedtime. It is a great way to share your thoughts and feeling about your day also.**

### **A reminder to everyone of our school's morning routine.**

Our school gates will open promptly at 8:30am each morning to ensure a calm, safe and organised start to the day.

For the safety and wellbeing of all our students, we kindly request that children are not left unsupervised before this time. We understand the morning rush can be hectic, which is why we offer Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) services from 7:00am until 8:30am for families requiring early drop-off options.

By adhering to this schedule, we can provide a safe and secure environment for all our students as they begin their day. We appreciate your cooperation in prioritising the safety and welfare of all students.

### **Students Walking to School**

Just as a reminder, if your child walks to or from school without an adult can you please talk to them about being wary of approaches from strangers. If they are approached, students should not respond and should not accept offers of rides or gifts.

Students should seek the assistance of other nearby adults if they feel unsafe and should report the event to a trusted adult (parent or school staff member) as soon as possible.

SAPOL advises that taking out a mobile phone and calling police can deter the offender and they recommend the student making a formal report to their closest police station.

# RRHAN-EC

## Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect – Education and Care

The updated RRHAN-EC courses were released on plink on Monday 29 April 2024 and, for most of us, completion of the online update will need to be done before 31 December 2024 when our current certificate expires. You need to complete the new RRHAN-EC online update unless you already have a current certificate with an expiry date of 31 December 2027.

To access the online update please use this [link](#) to login as 'Non Department for Education staff login' OR if you don't already have a plink login, register [here](#).

If your RRHAN-EC has already expired or you are new to education, please refer to the following guide which will help you to determine which course you need to do.

### Which course is right for you?

**My certificate expires on 31 December 2024** – do the online update only (takes about 2 hours).

**My certificate is expired** – start with the fundamentals. If you also work directly with children and young people, do the masterclass after you've finished the fundamentals course.

If you have not yet made your instalment for Term 1 please do so ASAP, a friendly reminder was sent with your statement. If your account is in credit due to the 5% discount or Basketball refund this will be carried forward until next year. I have posted out your account this term so you know you have a credit, but will **not** post a credit account each term as this amount should not change.

Statements are posted out each term so those with payment plans can see the payments allocated to your account and as a reminder that the current terms instalment is due soon.

Online School Card applications for low income families have now been processed and applied to all approved accounts. If you still need to apply, please do so now via this link or come in and see me as it only takes a few minutes.

including babies and children. A child's mental health can change, depending on what's going on in their life, and is shaped by many different things" (Emerging Minds).

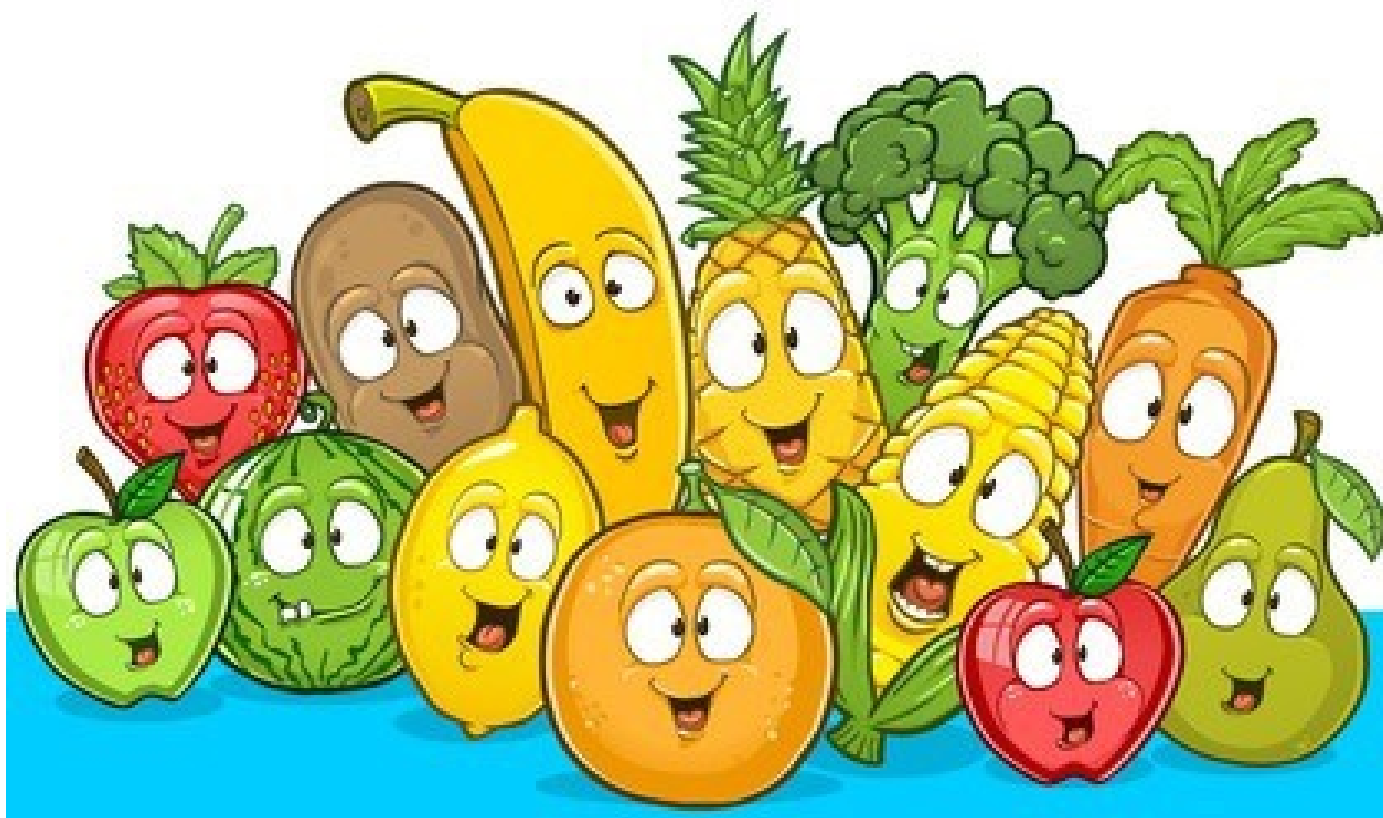

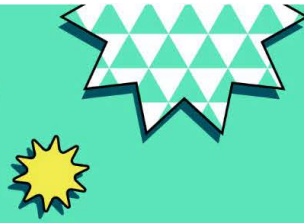

## Tram Grade Separation Projects

### Marion Road and Cross Road Level Crossing Removals

Upcoming works

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly (50/50) funded \$622 million to remove the level crossings where the Glenelg tram line crosses Marion Road and Cross Road, Plympton.

**When**  
From Saturday 11 May 2024 until late July, weather permitting.

**Typical hours of operation**  
**Night works** Sunday to Friday 7pm – 6am  
**Day works** Monday to Saturday 7am–5pm  
Some works will occur on Sunday.

**Where**  
**Marion Road and Cross Road** within the vicinity of the level crossings and intersection.  
**Marion Road and Anzac Highway** within the vicinity of the intersection.  
**Local side roads** Please see map overleaf.

**What's happening:**  
As part of our early works program, ground investigations and service relocations are continuing at multiple locations near the level crossings and intersections. Some investigations are also required in the rail corridor near the level crossings.  
Investigations will occur at each location for a short period of time and will move progressively around the area. These investigations will help inform the detailed design.  
Access to properties will be maintained during the works wherever possible. We will provide advance local notification for residents and businesses if access to your property is to be temporarily impacted.  
Should works be required for long periods of time in a certain area, more specific advance notice will be provided.  
Early works will continue until late 2024.

**How this affects you:**  
**Marion Road and Cross Road / Marion Road and Anzac Highway**  
To reduce impacts to road users, works at the intersections will primarily be undertaken at night. Some day works may also be required. Access to side roads from Marion Road, Cross Road and Anzac Highway will be closed intermittently for short periods of time, with local detours in place.  
Onsite signage and traffic controllers will be in place to assist.




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**Local side roads**  
To reduce impacts to residents, the majority of works on local side roads will be undertaken during the day. For safety reasons, some locations may require works at night. We will get in touch with you for any key night works activities.

**What you need to do:**  
During these works there will be changes to traffic conditions to keep everyone safe. Speed and lane restrictions will be in place while works are underway. Some short-term road closures and local detours will be required. Please follow traffic management directions and onsite signage. Outside of working hours, traffic will be fully reopened with all speed and lane restrictions removed.  
During these works there may be some noise disruptions. We will do our best to minimise noise where possible. Pedestrians and cyclists should take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons, there may be some restricted access. Signage will be in place to direct you to alternative access and/or detours.  
There will be no impacts to bus or tram stop or services as part of these works.

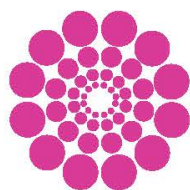
